CSG'S 12-HOUR SURVEILLANCE DAY.

Surveillance is the Art of Waiting. Wait long enough and your claimant will be active.

Here are two examples of an 8-hour vs. a 12-hour surveillance day.

The claimant is suing for his/her **alleged** right-arm injury from an auto accident.

1st Example of an 8-hour vs. a 12-hour surveillance day.

The **8-hour pi** works from **6 am to 2 pm**. The claimant's vehicle is in the driveway, but the claimant is not observed.

The **12-hour pi** works from **6 am to 6 pm**. The claimant **departs at 4 pm** to play tennis at a tennis club. **The 8-hour pi already departed** the area at 2 pm.

2nd Example of an 8-hour vs. a 12-hour surveillance day.

The **8-hour pi** works this time from **10 am to 6 pm**. The claimant is not observed, but the claimant's vehicle is in the driveway.

The **12-hour pi** works from **6 am to 6 pm**. **The PI has video** of the claimant washing and drying his/her vehicle **at 8 am**. **The 8-hour pi will start at 10 am and have no activity.**

With the 8-hour surveillance you have 2 days of **no activity**. **With the 12-hour surveillance** you have **video results on both days**.

Do not guess when a claimant will be active. **The more hours** a day CSG can work, the **better chance** of video results.

Remember, surveillance is the art of waiting. **Wait long enough** and the claimant will be active.
